European Firm sees 23rd Consecutive Year of Double Digit Growth

February 9th, 2010 - Norgine, the leading European specialty pharmaceutical company announced today that in 2009 its total revenue increased to €258m, with net product sales increasing by 9.1% to €254 million. On a constant currency basis, Norgine's net product sales increased by just over 11%, the 23rd consecutive year of double digit sales growth on this basis.

'In today's difficult economic climate, our continued investment in development programmes and in improving our business skills, quality and compliance to the highest industry standards has yet again paid dividends. We will continue to invest in our people, products and programmes which will help to grow our existing business in 2010 and beyond' said Peter Stein, Norgine's CEO.
